

DREMUK-WATTS FELLOWSHIP in SPECIAL EDUCATION

PROGRAM: Master of Science in Education (MS in Ed.) with emphasis in Professional Development in Special Education. This graduate program (33 hours) is designed for students who have a teaching background in general or special education and who are seeking advanced professional development in special education. This option consists of 24 hours of core courses and 9 hours of electives to be determined by the candidate and her/his advisor. This option does not lead to initial or advanced certification in special education for the State of Illinois or the United States.

For admission, international applicants must have completed a baccalaureate degree or a degree that is comparable to the U.S. baccalaureate from an internationally-recognized institution of higher learning. The baccalaureate degree usually represents four years of work at the college level and a total of 16 years of formal education.

A completed application consists of information required for SIUE graduate admission at <http://www.siu.edu/prospectivestudents/international/> as well as a statement of purpose (maximum three pages, double spaced) and three (3) letters of reference. The deadline for consideration of applications for the Dremuk-Watts Fellowship is April 1, 2011.
